## 5. The NDAS Newsletter

In the annual report you will have read of a plan to convert the NDAS newsletter to a digital form accessible through the NDAS website with a hard copy summary sent out to members who do not have access to the Internet. At the AGM it was pointed out that for many members the paper newsletter is the principal point of contact with the Society and that it has acquired benchmark status; it would be wrong to lose it. A newsletter sub-committee has been formed and has given further thought to the question with the following result:

The twice-yearly newsletter will be converted into an annual publication appearing in February, the first to appear in February 2009. As a yearly rather than six-monthly publication it will be more substantial than before. For contributions it will draw not only on NDAS activities but will invite contributions from groups and individuals who share an interest in the archaeology and history of northern Devon and adjacent areas. The content will aim to be soundly informative, newsy, occasionally humorous and above all to encourage interest in and understanding of the landscape that we inhabit. This will not be a scholarly publication, nevertheless contributions will be carefully edited for quality and reliability of content.
